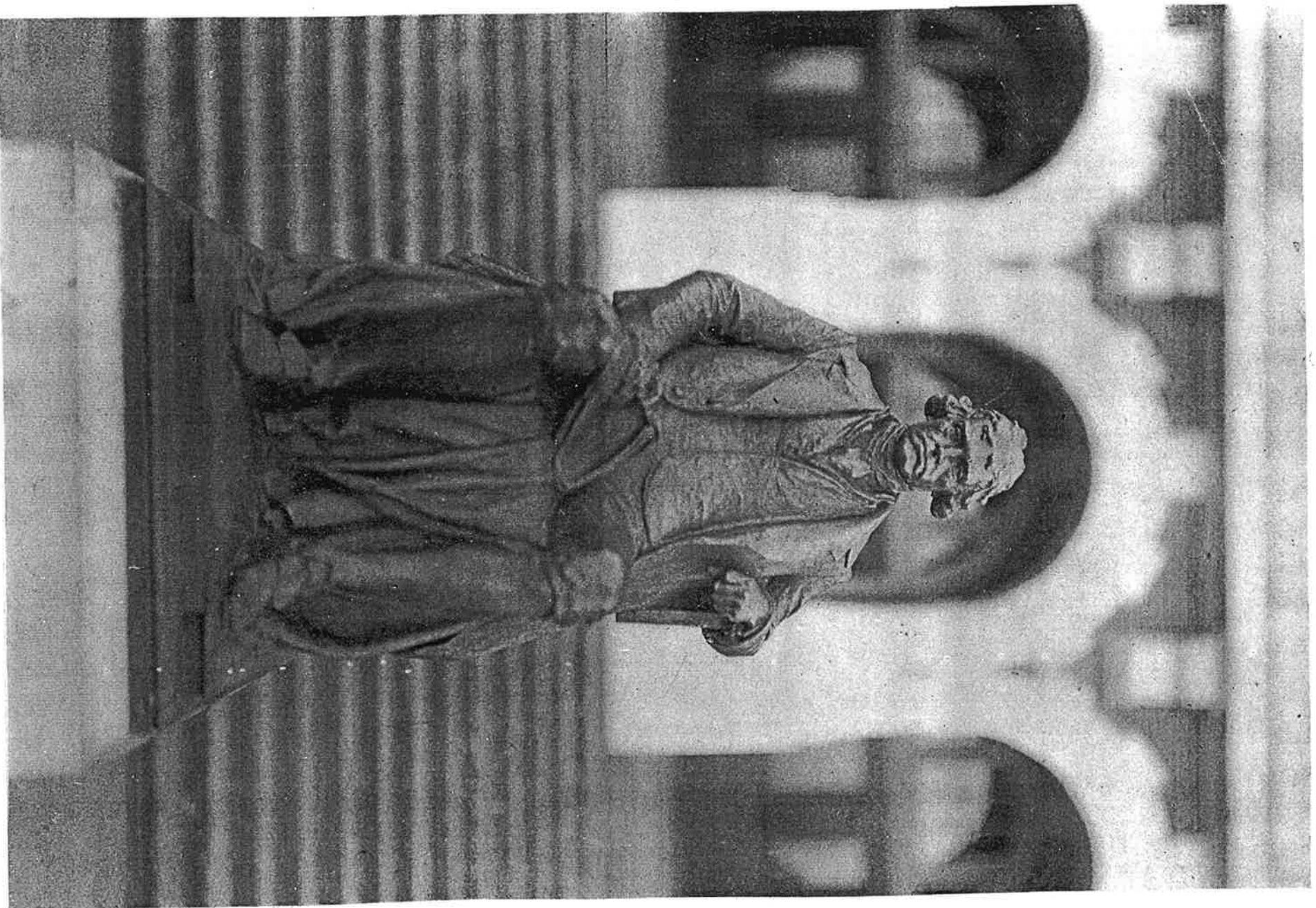

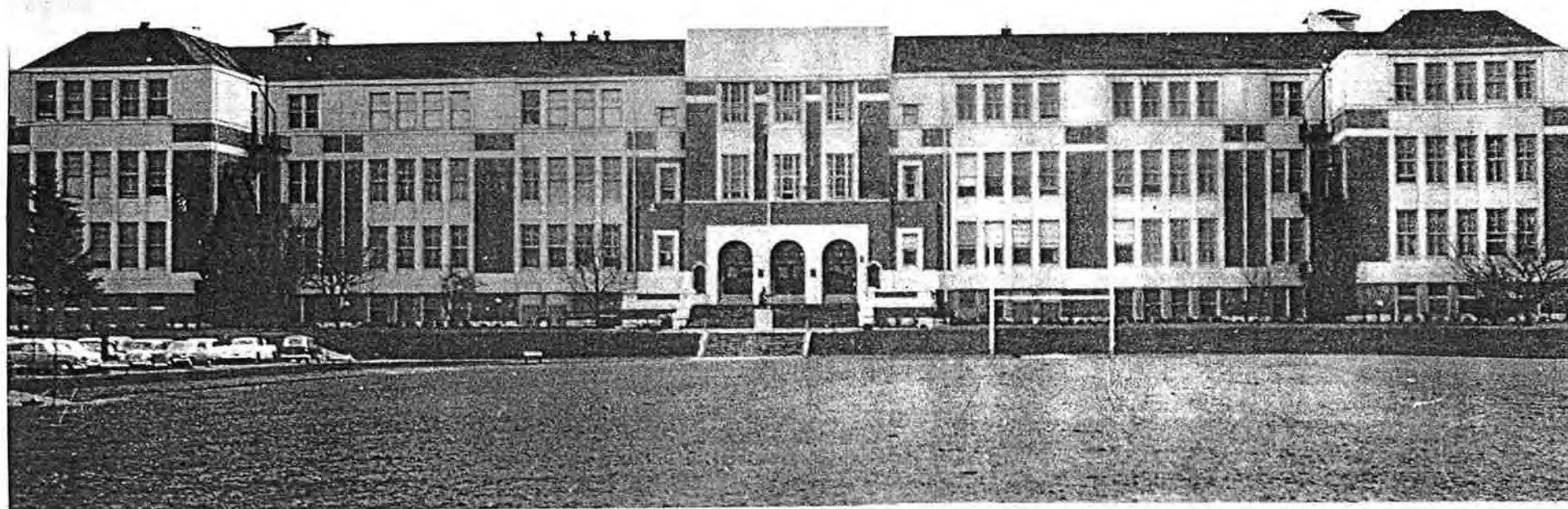

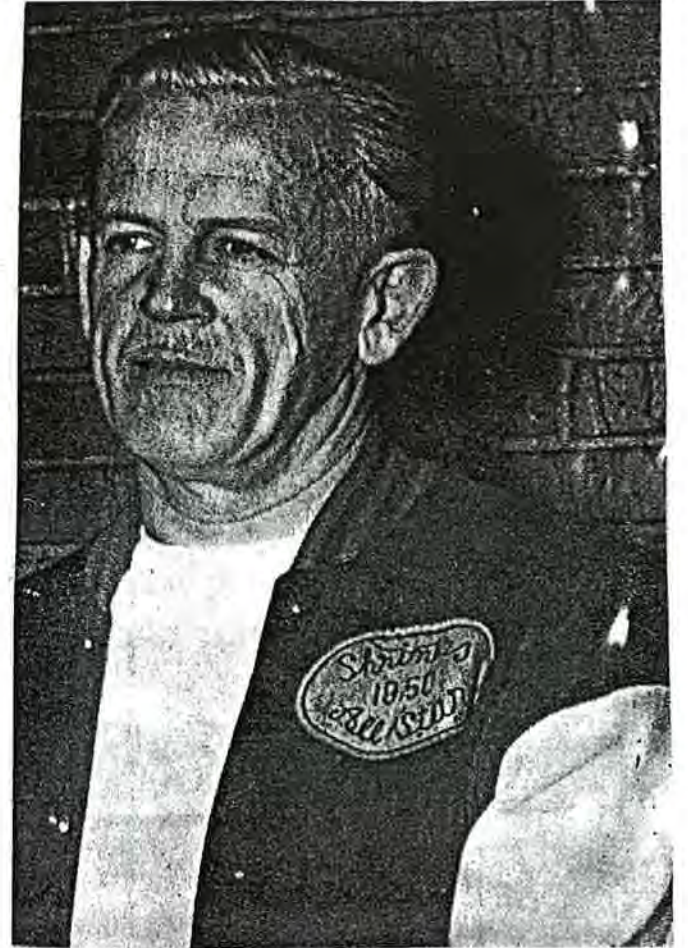

Waldorf dies at 76; Funeral set Saturday

Memorial services will be held Saturday in Forest Grove for one of Oregon's all-time greatest prep football coaches.

Eric Waldorf, 76, who coached Jefferson to 10 PIL championships, died Tuesday in that community of a heart attack while working in his yard.

Services will be held at St. Bede's Episcopal Church in Forest Grove at 10 a.m. Saturday.

Waldorf coached the Democrats for 22 seasons and had an overall PIL record of 108-33-12. Eight of his teams were unbeaten and five others lost just one game.

Some of Oregon's greatest athletes played football under Waldorf. Men like Bobby Grayson, Ben Ell, Jake Hegerl, Ralph Davis, Don Stanton, Floyd Simmons, Monte Brethauer, Max Anderson,

and assisting Duck Coach Tex Oliver.

would get out there and show you how," said Stanton, who went on to Oregon and played on the Webfoots Cotton Bowl team. "He worked us very hard and he taught us how to tackle head-on. Some people didn't like it but it was good football."

"He was a superior coach. I saw him at a banquet last year and he still looked in great shape," added Stanton.

Jerry Lillie, who coached for many years at Grant against Waldorf, said "Nobody had more respect for Eric than the Portland coaches. If you beat him, it made the season because he was our dean."

Renfro Story: It's Strictly Family Affair (winter 1960) From 'Pansy' To Homemade Hurdles

The Renfro name in Portland sports picture is a mighty big one. But it took some doing to start it out. You might say it was a little flower that did the trick.

A "pansy" while newspaper headlines have blared the success of Jefferson high school's Renfro brothers—Mel and Raye—the past few years, there's much more of a story that few people know, or remember. Mel and Raye weren't the only athletes in the family, they followed older brothers Dallas and Jim.

Jim, second of the four boys, tells of how the reign of Renfro feats started at Jefferson:

Wouldn't Turn Out

When Dallas was in high school, Mr. Waldorf (Eric Waldorf, then football coach) saw him in gym class and urged him to turn out for football. He (Dallas) wouldn't do it. Mr. Waldorf tried everything to get him out—he even called

him a 'pansy' . . . and one time during a school assembly he introduced Dallas to the rest of the kids as a 'pansy' that would have helped Jeff's football team.

That was all it took. Dallas turned out and even though he didn't play three games his

senior year was on the all-city team.

Then came Jim, who played halfback for the Demos—one year under Waldorf, two under Tom DeSylvia—his last year he was a second team all-city choice before going to Washington State for two years. And in the past two years the Renfro story was completed on the prep level with the graduation of all-city stars Raye, a full-back, and Mel, a jack-of-all-trades who played a little bit of everything.

Mel, surprisingly modest for the many honors that have been cast his direction, enters the University of Oregon this week. And there are many who say his athletic career is just starting. Only time will tell.

Mel Continues Climb

The other three brothers have evidently had their time in sports and will probably be watching as Mel continues his climb to fame. Dallas has just returned from a hitch with Uncle Sam and is working at the post office. Jim is working

double time now. During the day he works in the physical therapy department of the University of Oregon medical school. And during the evening hours he works in the Mulnomah Kennel club office. Raye, after scholastic troubles cut his college football career short

last fall, is working for a Portland accountancy firm. But there's a chance he will try the class room stint again in hopes of carrying on with brother Mel at Oregon.

Mel, one of the greatest athletes ever produced by the state of Oregon, has come a long way from his first efforts in sports.

"I remember," the ex-Jeff star smiles, "when I was in the third or fourth grade we nailed sticks to the side of the house and used them for hurdles. And

then in the back yard we dug a pit and filled it with some sawdust so we could high jump and pole vault. I remember that I could pole vault six and a half or seven feet," he laughed.

Home Made Hurdles

Hurdling those home made sticks on side of his house was the first effort on the part of a future interscholastic hurdle champion. Just this past spring, Mel entered a national high school meet in Los Angeles. There he won both the highs (13.8) and lows (19.4). At the same meet he broad-jumped 22.5, but that was only good enough for fourth place—but far enough to place in several Pacific Coast collegiate tracks meets held the same weekend.

In all, "Pel-Mel" has made his mark. He won state titles in the two hurdle events, the broad jump and was a member of the winning 880 relay team. Besides this he has also competed in the pole vault, high jump, 100 and the quarter-mile relay. There's talk of Mel's possibilities in the decathlon—and why not? The only four events he hasn't tried are the shot, discus, javelin and the 1500 meters.

Which sport does he prefer? "I don't know" was his reply, "It's tough to pick one. Football and track are about even. You get a special thrill from each sport—let's just say I like them both."

Although he's done just about everything there is to do in football (run, pass, kick, catch

passes and play defense), Mel's had one wish escape him. "I always wanted to play linebacker," he revealed. "But coach wouldn't let me. He said if anybody got through the line, he wanted me back there to catch them."

Just The Opposite

Brother Jim sitting nearby, laughingly inserted "that's one reason why Mr. Waldorf had me playing linebacker. He always said that if anybody broke through I couldn't catch them."

It's interesting comparing the senior years of Jim and Mel.

The crucial game—the city title at stake—in both cases was played against Lincoln. And in both cases the weather was the same—downpour of rain. And in both cases the game followed the same tough defensive struggle throughout.

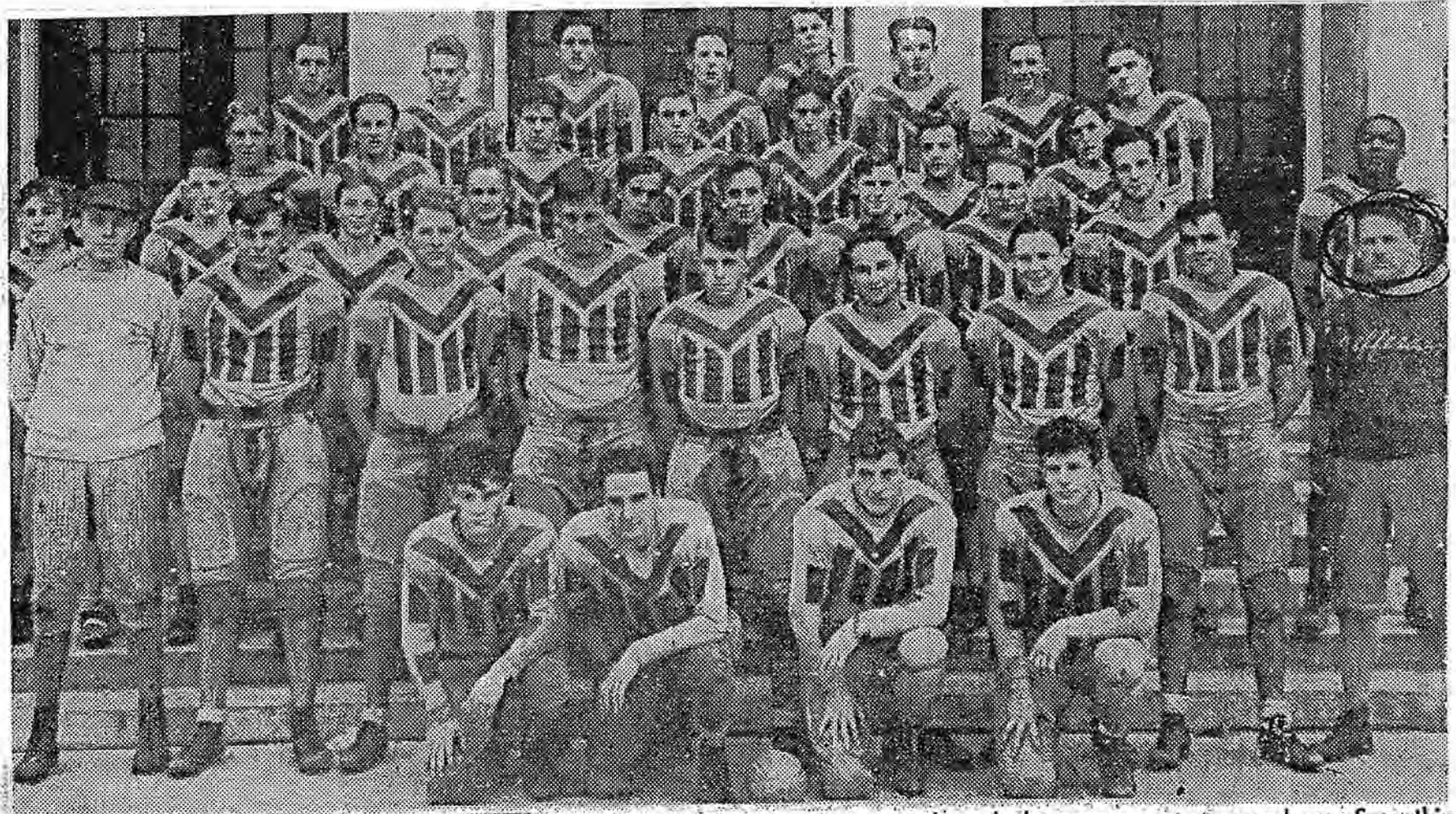
In 1955, Jim's Jefferson club won the title, 27-7, beating Lincoln in a ball game that saw the Demos break a 7-7 deadlock in the final three minutes to rout the Cards.

Long TD Romp

In 1959, Mel's Jeff club edged Lincoln 7-0, on one long touchdown romp by teammate Mike Barnes.

From a big, speedy athlete who was forced onto the football field after being tagged a "pansy" by his coach, and a third grade pee wee who learned to hurdle sticks nailed to the side of the house, the Renfro family has come a long way up the sports trail.

And the end is not in sight yet. Mel's still climbing.

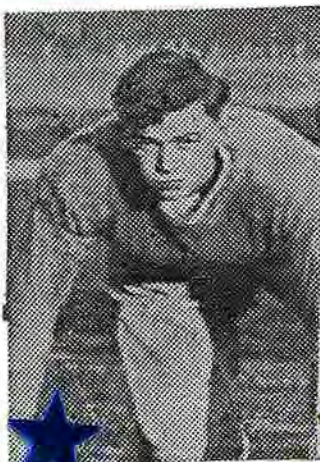

DeSylvia, former Jefferson coach, dies

Tom DeSylvia, who coached Heisman Trophy winner Terry Baker and NFL Hall of Famer Mel Renfro on Jefferson High School's dominant football teams of the 1950s, died Friday of a heart attack. He was 78.

DeSylvia coached the Democrats in 1953-61, leading them to state titles in 1957 and '58. He also led Jefferson to 34 consecutive victories in 1957-59, the longest winning streak in Oregon large-school history.

"Football was a major part of his life, but more than just the game, the kids themselves," said DeSylvia's son, Terry. "It's just always as-

tounded me that a person could reach out and touch so many people in such a positive way."

Baker, who won the Heisman as Oregon State's quarterback in 1962, once said he did not intend to play high school football until he spoke with DeSylvia.

"What was important to me was to get a summer job and make some money," Baker said in a 1999 interview. "Tom came to me and said that if I would play football, he would make certain I got a summer job. He kept his part of the agreement and I kept my part."

DeSylvia was a four-year letterman and two-way player for the

Beavers, playing in every game, and was captain in 1949. In 1994, he was inducted into Oregon State's Hall of Fame.

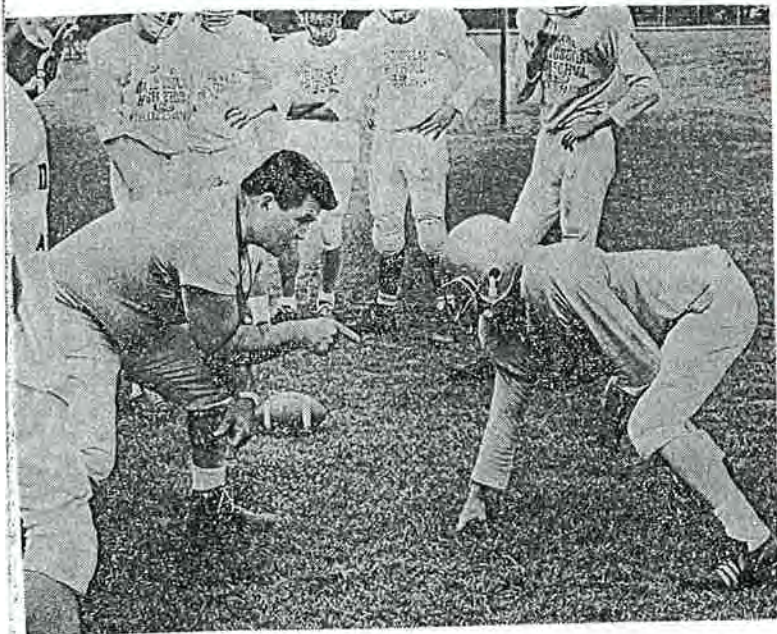
The Philadelphia Eagles drafted DeSylvia in the 24th round, but he never played in a game. He got into coaching and led football, wrestling and baseball teams at Jefferson, David Douglas and Grant high schools. In 1962, he took the Portland State football job and led the Vikings to a 4-4 record.

There will be a public viewing from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. today at Zeller Chapel of the Roses in Northeast Portland. Services will be private, but DeSylvia's family is planning a memorial service for January.



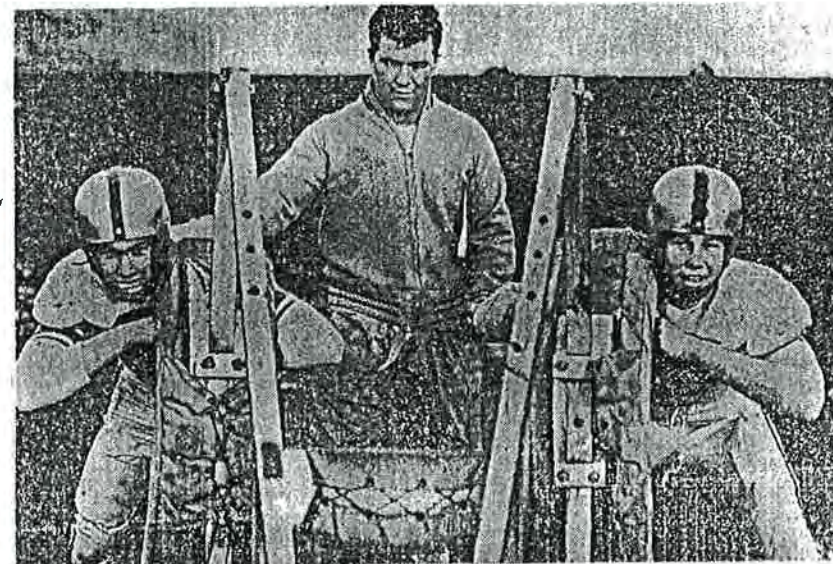
Coach DeSylvia being carried off the field at Jeff after beating Grant 13-7 in 1961 for his 5th City Championship in a row.

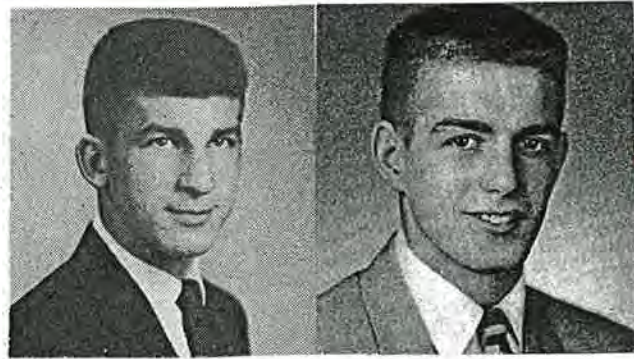
