Dear Eldon & Members of Washington High Alumni,

Thank you for your very generous gift. As we begin a new school year, I am reminded that it is friends like you who have helped to sustain our school for the past 16 years. It was a busy summer and the school year has started off with much activity.

As many of you know, we lost our lease and had to move to a new space at 5441 SE Belmont Street. At the end of the regular school years, employees form the Windermere North and Northeast offices helped our staff pack everything but what we needed for summer school. Once summer school ended on July 19th, employees from the Entercom Radio stations finished packing our remaining supplies and furniture. Because our new space is much smaller, our staff has had to pack and put in storage about half our school, and we appreciate Eldon Bolstad for donating the storage space.

School began on August 30th. We had our largest first day enrollment ever with 57 students. By the end of the second week, we had 73 students enrolled. It was great to see so many faces, and the children were so happy to be back in school. We ended the first day of school with the CTS tradition of gathering everyone together and toasting the new school year with root beer floats. By the end of the second week, we had begun our traditional weekly kickball game between my class (2nd-5th) and Marna's (5th-8th). Although we might not be as skilled and as big, we are heavy on the player side with 31 players versus 18. Since the game cannot end until each child has had a chance to kick, we added extra innings after lunch. As the 6-4 score shows, we had a lot of 3up/3 down on my side.

The children are settling in and we all are getting used to our new space. My class is learning about different geographical landforms, the phases of the moon, and spiders and their webs.

We have a lot of exciting things planned for the year ahead, including our capital campaign to build a new school, which you will be hearing more about in the coming months. Your support and encouragement mean a great deal to us; thank you again for your gift. Approximately \$10,000.00
